

We live in a time when our thoughts and opinions can be shared throughout the world at a moment's notice. with little to no accountability.

When I consider the fact that John 1:1 describes Jesus as the Word, it reminds me of the many times I have used my words judgmentally, hastily, and carelessly. God's Word tells us that it is not only what we say but how we say it that is important. What is equally important is what we choose not to say. God speaks purposefully into our lives. He doesn't waste words or speak without reason. Each word in Scripture has significance and power. We must never underestimate the power of our words to be life-draining rather than life-giving.

Because God is our Comforter, and we are created in His image, we naturally have a strong desire to comfort others. For many of us, that comfort involves speaking words of encouragement. Yet often what is not spoken can be just as powerful.

We must follow Jesus' example. We can breathe life into people with silence, by ministering with a hug, a listening ear, a helping hand, or simply our presence. We often ask the Holy Spirit to guide our words, but we also need to ask Him to guide our listening.

Over the last couple of months, I have begun praying Psalm 141:3: "Set a guard over my mouth, O Lord, keep watch over the door to my lips." The Holy Spirit responds often to me to be still, be respectful, let others speak and rely on Him to perfect your skill of active listening. Jesus used His words to bring life and hope to people. When there were no words to say, Jesus listened. Amen

Last Sunday evening, April 2nd, many from the EPIC group experienced a Messianic Passover Haggadah. This means the telling (Haggadah) of the Passover meal hosted by Jesus (Messiah). Passover recognizes the night that God protected the Israelites from His final plaque over Egypt where the first born sons were klled.

Through Moses, the Israelites were instructed to sacrifice a perfect male lamb and mark their doors with the blood of that lamb so the plague would pass over their homes. After Pharoah's son was killed, Pharoah ordered the Israelites to leave Egypt. They fled immediately.

Exodus 12:14 we learn that God said, "This is the day you are to commemorate; for the generations to come you shall celebrate it as a festival to the Lord – a lasting ordinance." Thus, the Jewish tradition of Passover began.

On the night before He was crucified, Jesus gathered with the disciples to celebrate the Passover in Jerusalem. They ate the traditional Passover meal and Jesus took the bread and said eat, "This is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me." (Like 22:19) He also took the cup of wine, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you." (Luke 22:20) Thus Jesus was telling the disciples and all generations that He, the Messiah, was the lamb to be sacrificed to save all who believed in Him.

We celebrate the Messianic Passover when we celebrate the Lord's Supper with the elements of the bread and wine that Jesus shared with His disciples.
